ODPP completes legal review of allegations against 11 Police Officers

The Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (ODPP) has completed its legal assessment of 11 police dockets referred by the Fiji Police Force concerning allegations arising from a series of Facebook posts containing screenshots of Viber messages.

The complaint stemmed from Facebook posts allegedly implicating 11 police officers for receiving corrupt benefits or bribes and engaging in discussions relating to illicit drug activities.

Following a careful review and assessment of all the available evidence, the Acting Director of Public Prosecutions has determined that there is currently insufficient evidence to institute charges against any of the 11 police officers.

Accordingly, the ODPP has returned the investigation dockets to the Fiji Police Force today (6.8.26) together with recommendations for further investigations with additional matters for the Fiji Police Force to consider.

The ODPP will conduct a further review of the files should further investigations yield new or sufficient evidence that establishes or supports the commission of any criminal offence.
